



MAP-11



The 42nd Rainbow Division was very heavily involved in this battle that turned the tide of The Great War and led to the capitulation of Germany on November 11, 1918.


More details of this area are shown on the next few pages.



The 42nd Rainbow Division was heavily involved in the dark shaded area above. See dashed lines indicating the lines of advance for July 24 and July 27.

Since O. B. Thomas was wounded on July 26, these lines place him at the approximate location pointed to above.


MAP-13 WAR MAPS-14



This map is from "Alabama's Own in France," by William H. Amerine, 1919.

There is no scale shown on this old Amerine map. But by estimating from the larger Amerine map, the distance from Beuvardes to the east side of the Red Cross Farm seems to be about 1.5 miles. So, the the farm width shown here may be about 1/3 mile. There was VERY heavy hand to hand fighting here, and Oscar B. Thomas was wounded here by machine gun fire on July 26, 1918.
