

Dear Mr. and Mrs. Laye:

We promised to communicate with you upon receipt of information concerning the remains of your son, the late Second Lieutenant Henry M. Lays, Jr.

The official report of burial has been received and discloses that the remains of your son were originally buried in an isolated grave at Sessenheim, (Bas Rhin), France, but were later disinterred by our American Graves Registration Personnel, and reinterred in Plot AAAA, Row 7, Crave 83, in the United States Military Cemetery St. Avold, located twenty-three miles east of Metz, France.

The remains have been properly identified, casketed and are being held in above ground storage pending disposition instructions from the next of kin, either for return to the United States or for permanent burial in an overseas cemetery.

According to our records the identification of the remains of your son was established through favorable comparison of tooth charts made for the deceased with those maintained in Army dental records for your son. Comparison was also made of physical characteristics, with favorable results, namely the estimated height, weight and color of hair for the deceased compared favorably with the height, weight and color of hair listed in Army records for your son. In addition to this evidence the 2/It bars, Officer's Infantry insignia and type of clothing found on the remains were in agreement with your son's rank and branch of service. Furthermore, the date and place of death as given on the official report of burial are in agreement with the records in the Adjutant General's Office for your son.

Pursuant to authority granted under Public Law 368, 80th Congress, the Secretary of the Army has established the order of precedence among relatives eligible to direct final disposition of a decedent's remains. Accordingly, the widow has prior disposition authority unless she was separated, divorced or has remarried. In either of these events the right of disposition automatically reverts to the parents, the father having precedence over the mother.

May I extend my sincere sympathy in your great loss.



Case History attached to Corrected Report of Burial states that a check of unresolved casualty rosters reveals Lt. Laye to be the only officer killed in the vicinity of Sessenheim who is still unaccounted for. A check of the Unresolved Casualty Roster in this Office shows Lt. Laye to be the only officer carried for the 232nd Infantry Regiment.

Records in this Office indicate there are four additional Unknowns disinterred from Sessenheim who are still to be identified. Of these, three (X-5454, X-5455 and X-7023 Neuville) were recovered from tanks near Sessenheim and therefore can be eliminated from consideration. The remaining Unknown, X-6140 St. Avold, cannot be favorably associated with Lt. Laye.

Unknown K-6133 St. Avoid has been identified by the Field as Pfc. Bernard H. McGowan 16126533, also a member of the 232nd Inf-antry Regiment who was KIA on the same date as Lt. Laye and was also recovered at Sessenheim.



At 1730 on 19 January 45 under the command of Col. McNAMEE, troops consisting of elements from the 103d Division, a battalion of the 79th Division with armored reinforcements were committed on a large scale attack to relieve the situation, but could not gain ground because of heavy opposition. That night the 232d Infantry was ordered into Corps Reserve, and withdrew in orderly fashion through the Haguenau woods to Bossendorf. On 20 January the Regimental CP moved from Camp d'Oberhoffen to Mon Fre de Birklach. At 1730, 21 January, the Regimental CP at Bossendorf was established, with the regiment deployed in that town; Cannon and Anti-Tank Companies, in Wickersheim; and the train bivouac, in Walshausen.

On 23 January 45, the reorganization of all personnel was completed. Equipment clothing, and ordnance shortages on requisition were partially restored. Anti-aircraft defenses and road blocks, with twenty-four hours guard on all roads, were established. The regimental, Battalion, and Special Troops Commanders, as well as the Regimental Officers and men, held general discussions and critiques of combat experiences. The reconnaissance of the VI Corps areas were completed as well as the plans for the probable employment of the regiment to counterattack or strengthen front line defenses. 

Dental records for Lt Laye were obtained and compared against tooth chart prepared for X-6146 and found to be similar. Estimated height and color of hair as indicated for X-6146 also agree favorably with that of Lt Laye. Estimated date and place of death of X-6146 in agreement with AG Casualty records for Lt Laye. Finding no contradictory information these remains are being identified as those of: LAYE, Henry M., 2nd Lt., 0-552664 of the 232nd Infantry Regiment, 42nd Infantry Division.
