Dear Mr. Slominski:

This is to inform you that the remains of your loved one have been permanently interred, as recorded above, side by side with comrades who also gave their lives for their country. Customary military funeral services were conducted over the grave at the time of burial.

After the Department of the Army has completed all final interments, the cemetery will be transferred, as authorized by the Congress, to the care and supervision of the American Battle Monuments Commission. The Commission also will have the responsibility for permanent construction and beautification of the cemetery, including erection of the permanent headstone. The headstone will be inscribed with the name exactly as recorded above, the rank or rating where appropriate, organization, State, and date of death. When Mr. Stenger, 65 Goetzenbruck, France, was interviewed by the investigator about the discovery of remains in recently demined areas, he reported to have found in Sept 1946 the remains of an Unknown Soldier presumed to be American, about one kilometer South East of Lemberg, France.

Upon investigation the remains were located in a foxhole, as inclosed sketch shows. They were identified as American by items of clothing and equipment. Despite a thorough search it was impossible to establish the identity of deceased.

It is estimated that subject deceased met his death in January 1945 when there was fighting in the vicinity of Lemberg.

Investigation was started in Bouxwiller between 1030 and 1145. Mr. GOTTI, Mayor of Town, stated that to his knowledge there were no remains of American soldiers in the territory of town at the present time. All American casualties were removed during combats by American troops; there is no notice of disinterment in town-hall.

Mr. HENNEQUIN, Chief-Gendarme, stated the same and could not give valuable information concerning subject deceased. Investigation was conducted at the town-hall of Barenthal at 1600 hours, where Miss HAURY, secretary of town-hall stated that all remains of American soldiers found in the territory of Barenthal were reported to AGRC and evacuated by same. So far there is no bodies of American soldiers in the Barenthal area. Unknowns checked on notice of disinterment did not give the certitude of the removal of above soldiers.

Arrived Mouterhouse 1730 hours.

Miss Lang, secretary to town-hall, stated the same as above and could not give information about subject decedents.

Arrived Goetzenbruck Althorn 1830 hours.

Mr. Kirrman, Mayor of town, also stated that all bodies of American soldiers found in Goetzenbruck area were removed and that he could not give information about abovementioned deceased.

Left Goetzenbruck 1915 hours.

Arrived Bouxwiller 1945 hours.

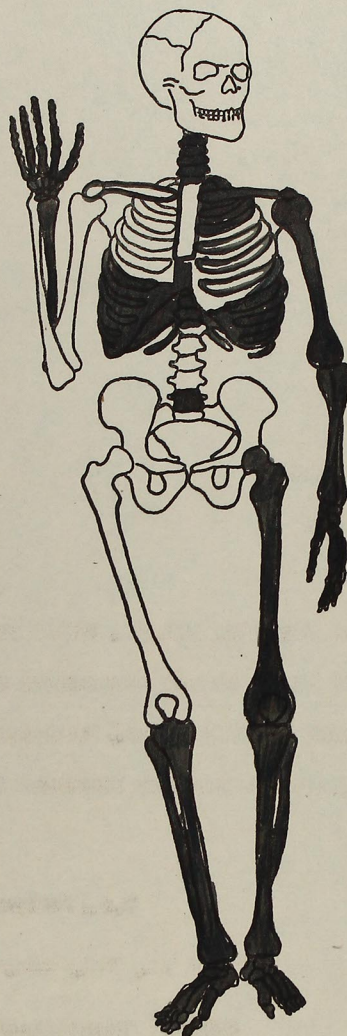

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicusps (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. re 242d Infantry Regiment

The 242d Infantry Regiment was operating in the vicinity of Lemberg on the 15 March 1945.

On the 14 March the new Mission with one platoon of tanks attacked from their present position along the axis: Althon-Melch-Pettit - Merthan-Ludwigs - Winkel. They encountered extensive mine fields and heavy mortar and machine gun fire, which held up the attack. Enemy fire was silenced and mine fields on the road to the intersection above Melch were breached.

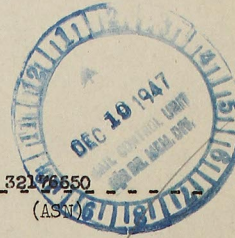
On the 15 March the 242d Infantry Regiment captured the town of Barenthal (near Lemberg). They encountered extensive mine fields and received small arms and mortar fire, which slowed up the advance in the early stages of the attack. However, they continued to move steadily ahead and by nightfall had captured the town of Barenthal. The advance was through difficult terrain - mountainous and heavily wooded.
